RETURN TO PLAY PROTOCOL

Riverdale Community Centre



Statement of Commitment

Riverdale Municipality is committed to ensuring the health and safety of all visitors/user groups of Riverdale Community Centre (RCC). This document provides our Return to Play Protocol. We recognize that the COVID-19 pandemic is fluid, and it is our goal to provide you with a safe space to enjoy recreational activities while adhering to provincial/federal regulations.



Provincial Response Level: Restricted

Community transmission of COVID-19 is occurring and vaccinate rates are increasing. However, case counts are rising. As of Tuesday, October 5, 2021, the Chief Provincial Public Health Officer has set the response level to orange.

GENERAL FACILITY GUIDELINES

Riverdale Community Centre (RCC) has implemented measures to ensure Provincial standards are being met, with public safety being our highest priority.

- All patrons entering the facility will be required to complete the self-screening questionnaire prior to arrival.
- Stay home if you are feeling sick or unwell.
- Mandatory mask usage is in effect (exception to those participating in ACTIVE PLAY, or if you are under the age of 5) for all common areas of RCC. This includes:
 - o Common areas
 - o Spectating areas
 - o Dressing rooms
 - o Benches (for coaches in a game setting)
- If you are attending RCC for a meeting function/private event you must sign in for contact tracing purposes.
- All patrons entering the facility must adhere to the latest Government of Manitoba travel restrictions and self-isolation regulations.
- All patrons and staff members must adhere to proper physical distancing guidelines. A minimum of a 2-meter distance must be maintained while standing/sitting throughout RCC. Distance markers will be throughout the facility.
- Players, team staff, officials and spectators should avoid congregating in small or large groups anywhere in the facility.
- Upon entry, hand sanitization will be mandatory. Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the facility.
- Proof of vaccination:
 - o Over the age of 18: You must be able to provide proof of full immunization or show that you have a government issued exemption for not being fully vaccinated.

- Between the ages of 12-17: You must be able to provide proof of at least 1 dose of vaccination after December 5, or provide a negative recent (within 72 hours) test result from an authorized pharmacy.

Hockey Arena Specific Guidelines

GENERAL ARENA GUIDELINES

All ice bookings must be made through the Manager of Community Services. Ice times are not inter-changeable. Any changes to ice times must be approved by Management.

Access to the facility is limited to 45 minutes before scheduled ice time (games) and 30 minutes for prior to bookings for practices. We strongly encourage that you come “ice ready” (fully dressed, minus helmet & skates). Additional time spent in building may relate to extra billing costs.

Dressing rooms will be pre-selected. Limit time in dressing rooms. Additional chairs have been added in the middle of each dressing room to encourage physical distancing when possible.

There is a zero tolerance for spitting, spraying water bottles, or fighting within RCC. Failure to comply may result in future bookings being suspended.

User groups are responsible for sanitizing any shared equipment between uses.

You must leave the building as quickly as possible following your rental.

While on ice:

1. Maintain physical distancing as much as possible. On-ice drills must be designed to allow for physical distancing between players and coaches.
2. Physical contact for goal celebrations is prohibited
3. Handshakes after games are prohibited
4. Maintain physical distancing while on benches.
5. Masks must be worn by coaches in a game setting

You must adhere to your PSO for additional return to play policies.

Coaches/Managers must be able to manage their teams in a way that respects the current guidelines.

As of December 6, 2021: Proof of at least one dose of vaccination, or a recent (within 72 hours) negative test result will be required for 12-17 year old's participating in indoor recreational sports/activities.

SPECTATORS

Spectators over the age of 18 must be fully vaccinated (unless exempt). If you are between the ages of 12-17 you must be able to either provide one dose of vaccination, or a recent (within 72 hours) negative COVID test result.

Spectators must report directly to designated viewing area after dropping off/assisting child.

Social distancing (2-meters) must be maintained in spectating area. There are no capacity limitations on spectators, however, capacity may be limited as a 2-meter distance must be maintained between different households.

Spectating capacity is reduced to 50%. Our screening clerks/rcc staff will ensure that numbers do not exceed our capacity restrictions. If we are at capacity, we will not allow new patrons in the building.

Curling Rink Specific Guidelines

GENERAL CURLING GUIDELINES

If you are between the ages of 12-17 you must be able to either provide one dose of vaccination, or a recent (within 72 hours) negative COVID test result to participate in indoor recreational activities at RCC.

Spectators over the age of 18 must be fully vaccinated (unless exempt). If you are between the ages of 12-17 you must be able to either provide one dose of vaccination, or a recent (within 72 hours) negative COVID test result.

Access to the facility is limited to 30 minutes before and after your scheduled draw time. We strongly encourage that you come "ice ready". Mask wearing is mandatory when not involved in active play.

Spectating capacity is reduced to 50%. Our screening clerks/rcc staff will ensure that numbers do not exceed our capacity restrictions. If we are at capacity, we will not allow new patrons in the building.

Maintaining physical distancing in dressing rooms is recommended.

While on ice:

1. Measuring units must be sanitized after each use. Prior to measuring, participant must sanitize their hands before and after use.

2. Stones should be sanitized at the start of each draw. Players will select their stones – these will remain their stones for the draw. No interchanging during the game. Players are not to touch any stones other than their own.
3. Handshakes are prohibited before and after games.
4. Players stay on the same side of the sheet during their games to maintain proper social distancing.
5. Scoreboards will not be used, consider writing down scores on paper, or using a phone to keep proper records.

You must adhere to your PSO for additional return to play policies.

Dance Club Specific Guidelines

GENERAL DANCE GUIDELINES

If you are between the ages of 12-17 you must be able to either provide one dose of vaccination, or a recent (within 72 hours) negative COVID test result to participate in indoor recreational activities at RCC.

Access to the facility is limited to 30 minutes before and after your scheduled dance practice. We strongly encourage that you come ready.

Spectating capacity is reduced to 50%. Our screening clerks/rcc staff will ensure that numbers do not exceed our capacity restrictions. If we are at capacity, we will not allow new patrons in the building.

Any shared equipment must be sanitized prior to, and after use.

Social distancing must be maintained when possible.

Mask wearing is mandatory when not involved in active play.
